

Nevis Public School 2022-2023 Plan Electronic Learning Days (E-Days)

NPS will continue to use Electronic Learning Days to make-up for up to five days that may be missed due to inclement weather during the course of the school year. Students and staff will collaborate electronically to conduct a school day from home when they cannot make it to school due to poor weather conditions. “E-Learning Days” are school days that do not take place in the school building but teachers and students engage in learning activities online. Teachers, students and parents communicate through ParentVue, and/or other online learning platforms. Teachers will develop, share and guide students through online assignments. Nevis students should work on assignments at home under the supervision of the classroom teacher who will be available for support during traditional school hours (8 am to 3:35 pm).

Your child’s classroom teachers have created a digital opportunity to interact with their students on days when they cannot make it to school. Throughout the fall months, your child’s teachers will communicate the E-Day plan to their students and share the process with you at home. Students with special needs should look for E-Day plans to come from their classroom teacher and special education teacher.

How does it work?

1. When school is cancelled, an electronic alert will go out to all families through School Messenger alerting them to an E-Day. Students should log onto their classroom sites by 10 am.
2. Classroom teachers will be available online from 8 am to 3:35 pm to answer questions and to help trouble shoot.
3. Elementary students should go to the Elementary Tab on the district website at nevis308.org
4. Click on the grade level and select their classroom teacher’s E-Day Lesson.
5. High school students should log onto each classroom teacher’s Google Classroom by 10 am and complete the daily assignment during the day.
6. Students will have four days to complete each E-Day. Your classroom teacher will identify specific due dates.
7. Students who do not have access at home should communicate with their classroom teachers as soon as practical to work out an alternative assignment.
8. Communication with your classroom teacher is the key to a successful E-Day. We realize there may be glitches and miscommunication but most can be solved by engaging with your teachers.
9. Attendance must be taken by each classroom teacher using one of the following methods:
 - a. Logging in to the Google Classroom class page(s)
 - b. Email exchange/text exchange/phone call with teacher.
 - c. Activity in classes (pages accessed, discussion participation, formative assessments completed).
 - d. Work submitted during the e-Learning day.
